Message From Your Pastor:

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Once again, we are ringing in the New Year of 2024. Why do we say we are ringing in the New Year? Because, "ring in the new year" is one notion of doing something to celebrate the new year, it employs the religious concept of Christianity, that ringing a bell can ward off bad things. (American University Alumni Association formed in 1921 to promote further mutual understanding between the people of Thailand and the United States through instruction in their respective languages, customs and traditions.)

Another New Year notion is to make a list of resolutions. I sit down every January 1st and make a list of goals for the New Year. Then the following New Year's Day, I see how many I was able to accomplish. I haven't looked at 2023's list yet, but I usually only accomplish about 50%! The other 50% are things yet to be done! Maybe in 2024!!!!

But what kind of resolutions would be helpful for Christians? I found a few online (https://proverbsmomma.wordpress.com/2015/01/01/5-new-years-resolutions-for-christians-and-10-bonus-resolutions-from-christianpost.com) that can help us ring in the new year and strengthen our relationship with God:

- 1. **Read your Bible daily (Psalm 119:105, Psalm 119:11, Romans 15:4, 2 Timothy 3:16-17)** Don't get overwhelmed. You don't have to read the entire Bible at once (because then you would never comprehend all that you have read), but take it one verse at a time.
- 2. **Go to church more often (Hebrews 10:24-25, Psalm 150:1-6)** It is so important to go to church regularly so you can be spiritually fed through the word of the Lord. It doesn't matter if you have read the Bible several times and heard a lot of different takes on the same verse, the word of the Lord is a living, breathing thing and changes as different people read it and new context is brought to it (Hebrews 4:12). It is also important to surround yourself with other believers to help uplift and support you and encourage you along the correct path.
- 3. **Pray for wisdom (James 1:5)** Wisdom is something most people do not think to ask for in today's society, but it is so important. If we have the wisdom of God within us, we will make the right choices and follow God wholeheartedly.
- 4. Find an accountability partner/friend who will help you grow in Christ and motivate and encourage you in the Lord. Having a peer who is strong in the Lord, has the same belief's as you, and can encourage you along the right path is such a

January 6 marks the day of Epiphany, when the wise men (who were Gentiles) came to worship Jesus and bring him gifts. During the church-year season of Epiphany, we remember that God's Son is the Light of the whole world.

Ponder the gifts of Epiphany with these two reflections, written centuries apart:

Your light, dear God, surpasses all other light, because all light comes from you. Your fire surpasses all fire, because your fire alone burns without destroying. The flames of your fire reach into the soul, consuming the sin and selfishness that lie there. But far from damaging the soul, your fire sets it ablaze with love. What moved you to enlighten me with your truth? The fire of your love was the reason. You loved me so much that you could not bear to see me confused and perplexed. Can I ever repay the burning love which you have given me? No, because I have nothing of my own to give. Yet you assure me that the love which you put into my soul is repayment enough. You desire only the joy of seeing me receiving your gift. What more perfect Father could there be!

3 Andrew McCutcheon Hoodies


12 Sweatshirts (Steelers, Penguins and Pirates)
